ENHANCING OUR SAFETY AND SUSTAINABILITY

At Mississippi Lime, we are guided by an unwavering commitment to safety, sustainability, and service. We believe that responsibly managing our operations is our duty.

With that in mind, we are constantly evaluating new ways to reduce our environmental footprint, protect the safety of our employees, and uplift people and communities.

We have reached several significant milestones in the last 12 months, with plans to continue improving in the years to come.

Some recent achievements include:

. Leadership for Sustainability

Fiona Woody joined our organization as our new Director for Sustainability and ESG, creating dedication and focus for our overall sustainability strategy.

Upgraded Safety Capabilities with Modern Tools

We invested in upgrading to a new, cutting-edge technology platform to track safety performance and train personnel on working safely.

Safety Culture Enhancements

Following a third-party audit of Mississippi Lime's safety culture, our team in Ste. Genevieve quickly translated assessment results into actionable initiatives, including improvements for engagement, communication, and supervisory presence in work areas, as well as additional forums for safety questions

Greener Energy Sources

We are presently maximizing the use of cleaner-burning natural gas in Ste. Genevieve to minimize our use of coal. We also committed to a major investment to eliminate the use of coal at our new Bonne Terre operation.

We began a study to determine feasibility and requirements for a solar array in Ste. Genevieve, which will increase our use of renewable energy and shrink our climate footprint.

We are also exploring opportunities to expand the use of renewable biogas created from waste (which we currently do at our facility in the United Kingdom) to more locations.

Investment in Our Community

In 2022, Mississippi Lime contributed or helped to raise over \$300,000 to support local causes where we live and work. We are proud to invest our time and resources to support organizations that generate positive impacts for education, health, community services, youth development, and more.

Our commitment to operating responsibly is not new, but these milestones demonstrate our recent progress.

Ongoing activities also include continuous improvements to optimize energy efficiency, reduce waste, and capture a portion of CO2 from emissions for re-use in circular production processes.

COMMUNITY ADVISORY PANEL SPOTLIGHT: DR. PAUL TAYLOR



Dr. Paul Taylor has been a dedicated educator in the Ste. Genevieve County R-II School District for over 20 years. He joined the district as a high school biology teacher, before advancing into roles as the middle school assistant principal, principal, assistant superintendent, and then deputy superintendent. Now, he takes a big step into the role of district Superintendent.

While not a native of Ste. Genevieve (originally hailing from and beginning his career in Perry County), the goodwill and camaraderie of the community made an

immediate impression on him.

"Ever since I've been here, it's felt like home. The amount of community support here astounded me. Obviously, moving in from the outside, I wasn't a hometown kid. But it just felt like the right fit, and the longer I worked here, the better it felt," Taylor said.

For example, the growth of the annual High School FRIENDS Polar Plunge is a point of pride for Taylor, seeing it grow with community support. In 2023, the Plunge raised \$22,000 for SG R-II athletes to attend the State Special Olympics.

He also credits the district's dedicated employees for creating a supporting and enriching environment for students.

"Kids come to us from all backgrounds. Our faculty and staff embrace them, build relationships with them, meet them where they are, and help them get the best educational experience they can. At SG R-II, there is always someone there to do what we can to meet each one of our students' needs."

In his previous roles, Taylor took up the helm for the middle school's mentorship

program for at-risk students, expanding on the foundation laid by Dr. Julie Flieg, and he also became a leader in restructuring new teacher induction and planning professional development days.

"As I moved into the principal position, the students I spent the most time with were those with more behavioral issues. I took on the role of the mentorship program and learned the ins and outs of it. Students are impacted by the relationships that they build with school employees...If we're not here for the kids, then why are we here?"

Now, as he transitions into his new role as district Superintendent, he looks ahead to the milestones on the horizon. Prop SG was passed in 2022 to improve the quality and accessibility of educational facilities in the district. The first project, the new entryway at Bloomsdale Elementary, is nearly complete, and the second project, the elevator at the middle school, will break ground this summer.

"My goal is to continue our tradition of fiscal responsibility and transparency with our stakeholders. They put a lot of trust in us by supporting Prop SG and the additions to the school district to provide services for the students. [We will] provide students with what they need while keeping an eye on the bottom line."

As part of the Mississippi Lime Community Advisory Panel, Taylor has enjoyed building a relationship with the company to understand its role in the community and find opportunities to collaborate.

"Mississippi Lime has been a partner with the district for a long time. Being able to hear the inner workings of what's going on at Mississippi Lime and other businesses in the community is really beneficial."

Taylor's passion is spending time with his family: wife Dana and children Adalynn, Ariella, and Paul. While he will soon have two kids in college and one in high school, Taylor and his family still make time to get together and make homemade pizza from scratch, a weekly family tradition.
